In my "spare" time I will serve as a Disaster/Trauma Clergy team member with Lee County, bringing an inclusive voice to those in desperate need of support.

One of my first acts as the congregation's intern is to coordinate All Faiths' efforts at the October 10th Pride Fest at the Alliance for the Arts and I need your help. The festival will run from 11 am - 5 pm on Saturday, October 10th. We are assembling a rainbow team of volunteers from All Faiths to staff our table in 1 or 2 hour shifts. The sign-up sheet is available on the activities table. We also will need LOTS of bottled water in either 8 oz or 16 oz bottles! Last year, one of the greatest acts of service we provided was COLD water for thirsty folks. Water can be delivered to the office during business hours.

INFORMATION SESSIONS AND OTHER OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEW PEOPLE

Starting in October there will be two types of meetings for people who are new or may consider themselves "fairly new." A **"Getting to Know YoUU Q & A"** session is a brief and informal time with the minister for new people to ask questions about All Faiths and/or UU. It will be held right after the service. The first one will be on **October 18** shortly after the service (11:40) and will be held in the Sanctuary. When we go to two services in November, there will be a session after each service: **November 15** after the early service (10:10) in the Minister's Office and after the second service (12:10) in the Minister's Office and after the second service (12:10) in the Sanctuary.

On **November 14** from 9:00-1:00 in the Social Hall we will have a "**UU 101.**" This is an orientation session for folks moving toward membership or who have recently joined. It will include UU History, All Faiths history, how we are organized, what being a member means—rights and responsibilities, the process of joining, opportunities for involvement and going deeper. This will be led by the minister, and will involve some board members, and some membership committee representatives. Even if you have been a UU elsewhere, we encourage you to attend to hear more about us and meet other new people.
